Impact of COVID-19 on UK charities

<https://www.theguardian.com/world/2020/jun/09/coronavirus-leaves-one-in-10-uk-charities-facingbankruptcy-this-year>

- Pro Bono Economics estimates a £6.4bn loss of income for UK charities in the next half a year
- one in ten UK charities will most likely go bankrupt by the end of 2020
- Small local charities will be affected the most, ...” reported they had to dramatically cut their services
- The National Trust has experienced a shortfall of £200m this year
- Age UK has experienced a £42m income loss
- Cancer Research UK worries it will lose £120m donated income in the coming year

What is it?

- Assess uncertain situations
- Make assumptions about what the future will look like
- Predict how environment will respond to future changes
- Explore alternatives to current practices
- New thinking
- Helpful when organisation is confronted with serious challenges

Why is it helpful?

- Future will become less scary
- organisation is better prepared for future challenges

Steps required in scenario planning

1. Mapping the environment

- What is the goal? Objectives?
- What uncertainties are we facing?
- What information do we have already?

2. Identifying scenarios

- Based on mapping done before, identify set of scenarios and timeframes
- When thinking about scenarios take into consideration: income, staff and volunteers, beneficiaries etc

3. Develop plans and ensure review

- What will each scenario mean for the charity? What changes will we have to undergo?
- How can we achieve our goals in the predicted scenarios?
- How do we ensure there is a regular reviewing process?

Step 1: Examine financial situation

- Analyse current situation, think about ways to respond to financial struggles
- Cash flow management is highly important: What money is available at the moment? What money will be needed in the following weeks, months (different timescales)? What income can we anticipate in those timescales?
- This will make it easier to predict time of future shortfall

Step 2: Options to reduce costs

- Minimise costs
- Stop inessential expenditure
- Collaborate with other charities to share resources
- Find cheaper alternatives eg technology

- How can sources of income be improved?
- Communicate with funders and inform them about your current and future struggles
- Think about local businesses you could collaborate with
- Are there any reserves you could utilise?

Step 3: Ensure review happens regularly

- Ensure monitoring of the situation will take place on a regular basis
- Continue cash-flow forecast as advised in step 1
- Use the serious incident form (<https://ccforms.charitycommission.gov.uk/report-a-seriousincident>) if you cannot operate as a charity anymore due to financial situation

What makes a successful application?

- Explain the objectives of your organisation and how your organisation helps communities
- Try to explain the goals of your organisation in a clear and straight- forward way
- Ensure you have a good idea of the amount of funds needed
- The amount of funds you request need to correspond with what you are able to deliver

What is important when applying for a grant?

- Ensure you have conducted sufficient research on the funder
- Ensure your social media sites and websites are updated, funders will conduct research on your organisation

What are common missteps in applications?

- Ensure you understand what the funders are asking: If you do not understand what is asked by the funder, ask them for clarification
- Ensure you send them the correct information eg correct bank account information, correct governance documents
- Ensure all the information you have provided in your application is of relevance and do not exceed the word limit

What are forms of collaboration in the charity sector?

- Formal collaboration: partnerships where funding is in the focus; can happen at local as well as national level
- Informal collaboration: sharing skills, knowledge; can happen at national, local as well as international level

How are charities collaborating?

- Collaboration and outreach; sharing of knowledge, information
- Learning how to sustain an organisation during lockdown eg working from home, using technology that is of no cost and easily accessible for everyone
- Funders have shown to be supportive of more collaboration

What is required before starting a collaboration?

- Analyse your organisation internally, be aware of your organisation's resources as well as strengths and shortcomings
- Be aware of your own goals and values as this is highly important when seeking a partner for collaboration
